

Message from the President



Dear Friends,

I am pleased to report to you on another successful year at MCC Foundation. As we celebrate our continued progress, we recognize that these achievements would not have been possible without loyal friends like you.

In 2022-2023, the Foundation received \$555,748 in gifts—a 36% increase since 2020! This generosity was made possible by more than 600 donors who helped make the Manchester experience more accessible for a new generation of students. We were also proud to welcome over 150 new donors.

This generosity combined with endowment income enabled the Foundation to disburse \$1.2 million to the campus—a new record! This included \$954,298 in scholarships to 750 students—also new records! In a year in which the costs of housing, utilities, groceries and childcare remained higher than ever, your support was life-changing for these students.

Significant investments were also made in academic programs, emergency student aid, Cougar Food Pantry, equipment and technology. For example, the Virtual Environment for Radiotherapy Training (VERT) received significant software and hardware upgrades. This will give students in the Radiation Therapy program access to training equipment available nowhere else in New England. The Foundation also equipped the new allied health classroom and laboratory with state-of-the-art technology and equipment to meet workforce demands for the next generation of healthcare workers.

I enjoyed meeting many of you at the Foundation's events this past year, including the Culinary Art program's Gourmet Dinner, Retiree Luncheon, Alumni Dinner, and Donor Recognition and Awards Reception. Our community is bound together by a shared commitment to ensuring access to the transformational power of higher education.

The impact of your investment in the Foundation is immeasurable because it literally changes the trajectory of students' lives. This in turn meets the needs of our regional economy and makes our communities stronger. Your acts of generosity will have ripple effects for years to come!

As you review the accomplishments celebrated in this report, I hope you will smile with pride in what we have all made possible together. On behalf of the MCC Foundation Board of Directors, thank you for remembering—and meeting—the needs of our students.






2022-23 Revenues*
