Message from the President

Dear Friends,

Your commitment to enhancing quality, equity, accessibility and affordability in higher education, through your support of MCC Foundation, is clear. There is much to celebrate over the past year, and it wouldn't have been possible without you.

While notions of "normal" began to return to our lives, significant economic challenges continued to pose real barriers for students. Thankfully your support for MCC students remained strong, helping ensure that the pandemic, inflation, housing costs, gas prices and unemployment didn't derail deserving students from their journeys toward a brighter future.

In 2021-2022 the foundation received \$536,457 in gifts—an astonishing 70% increase over the previous year! This extraordinary generosity was made possible by 676 donors—an impressive increase of 40 percent. We are grateful that so many of you increased your giving as our students faced unprecedented challenges. We are also proud to have welcomed 250 first-time donors.

This generosity helped make it possible for MCC Foundation to greatly increase its support of the college. In 2021-2022 the foundation disbursed over \$1.2 million to the college including \$855,000 in scholarships. These are record-breaking levels of support!






2021-22 Revenues and Support*
